

“Polish Private Law” – author guidelines

1. The “Polish Private Law” (hereinafter: PPL) website focuses on Polish private law in its current state and on-going developments. The **texts submitted for publication should conform to the site’s subject matter**, being both **narrative** (reporting on particular occurrences in the field of private law) and **discursive** (presenting the author’s point of view).
2. The texts published on PPL **should expand upon current events in Polish private law** (including statutory amendments, case-law and publications on Polish law), or more general tendencies, as well as descriptive materials on institutions, regulations and doctrinal concepts.
3. All the texts submitted for publication should be in English, **and should be between 2,500 and 15,000 characters long** (including spaces). In individual cases, the editorial staff may approve longer materials.
4. The authors should introduce **all boldfaces, underlines and italics** they find necessary for their text. Foreign-language expressions (including Latin) should always be in italics (not including footnotes and endnotes).
5. The **title of the text** should be concise and informative. The editorial staff reserves the right to interfere in this respect.
6. The texts should be sent **exclusively as email attachments** in .doc or equivalent formats to the address: office@polishprivatelaw.pl
7. The texts should be accompanied by a **personal note on the author** (covering scholarly or professional affiliation and areas of interest), not exceeding 300 characters with spaces, as well as **the author’s photograph** (consistent with the style of other photographs on the website). The note may be contained in the file with the main text or in a separate file in the same format. The photograph should be submitted in .jpg format.
8. Once submitted, the text will be **reviewed on its merits and proofread**. The author will be informed of a positive or negative review. The final decision on publication may be made dependent on **the author introducing changes or additions**. Depending on their content and length, the texts are published in the main subject columns of the site, to be decided by the editorial staff, or in one of the special sections.
